Maria Tallchief was born Elizabeth Marie Tall Chief in Fairfax, Oklahoma to a Scotch-Irish mother and an Osage father At her mother's insistance, Tallchief began studying ballet at the age of three At the age of six, the Tallchief family, including sister Marjorie Tallchief, moved to Beverly Hills, California, where the

In 1951, Maria's marriage to Balanchine ended, but she stayed with the New York City Ballet She danced there for many years, performing in as many as eight shows a week In 1956, Maria married again and, in 1959, had a daughter In 1965, Maria Tallchief finally retired from the New York City Ballet She was ready for new challenges
